The Kings Swimmers at BSC Summer 2019

In the last two weeks of June 2019 the Sailing club hosted the Kings Swimmers open water swimmer's summer camps. The group is a small set up based in the south of England aimed to coach, support and promote open water swimming. There were two five day events where about 20 swimmers from all over the world took part. They were from as far afield



as the Canada, USA, Portugal, Germany and the UK. They completed a number of open water swims both in our coastal waters here in Banff as well as a number of lochs, including Loch Ness. They were also supported by members of the Deveron Canoe Club who shadowed the swimmers.



The club house proved ideal and a popular location for briefings, lunch breaks and a well-earned place to warm up.

The Club also supplied support in the use of our rib and marker buoys. The tall stick buoys in particular were a great success. They definitely helped the swimmers by giving a visible target to swim towards and stay in the right direction. The rib was also used as a platform to feed the swimmers high energy food and drink on their longer swims. I

would not recommend the high energy drinks they use. It tastes like runny treacle, but they seemed to appreciate it. The purposes of these sessions were to acclimatise and prepare swimmers for marathon swims. Many of the Swimmers had to complete a six hour qualifying swim in water of less than fifteen degrees to be able to attempt a swim across the English Channel. Others were training for a relay swim the length of Loch Ness. At 11 degrees the water off Banff was ideal. The weather was a bit hit and miss with big breakers off The Links forcing a change of plan and more inland swims. In all, it proved a great success with both the swimmers and the organisers. One of the swimmers form the USA stayed on for a few days and helped us out crewing on one of the 707s at the Portsoy boat festival.

Hopefully this will become an annual event. They have already booked in for next year. This is a great use of our facilities for the wider public as well as a boost to much needed funds.







Banff Sailing Club are delighted to have been able to support the Portsoy boat Festival, which took place on 22nd and 323rd June. Alistair Mackie stepped in at short notice to organise the race programme part of the festival.
