#### So what's been happening around the Harbour of late?

## Council public meeting


For those who missed the public zoom presentation from the project manager hosted by the Harbour team at Aberdeen council here are some points of interest.

As stated by Helen above it looks like the harbour will be shut from the end of January through to Mid-August for the major repair work to the Harbour walls. We live in hope that the weather is kind, the contractors stay on the ball, and we open a little earlier (ever the eternal optimist).

The council will effectively close off the majority of the harbour and areas around and on the approach to the railway pier. This will include access to both compounds and the pontoons accessed from the railway pier. Access can be gained to these areas but must be by appointment with 24 hours prior notice to the contractors. It was stressed that the restricted area is a building site and access should be for a specific reason and kept to a minimum.

This arrangement initially included access to all pontoons, but after representations by Helen, the restriction on access to the inner harbour pontoons has been lifted. Most boat have now been moved into this area allowing boat owners to freely access and work on their boats as and when required. Obviously COVID restrictions still currently apply.

Below is an extract from the presentation, a plan of the restricted areas marked within red lines.



The current position, which may change again, is that the upper compound (not marked within the red lines) as well as the car park to the rear of the Harbour Master's office Which is within the red lies) will both be used by the contractors for storage and there for not accessible to the public or other Harbour users. The Harbour master is trying to move boats from this compound to the lower one so that owners can work on them. We will monitor this change.
